

Kryssning över sundet

Scandinavian Polska

This tune was composed at the Scandinavian Pipe Band Championships 1983 at Helsingborg, by Iain MacPherson together with another polska 'Helsingborg'. Iain was inspired by the polska rythm after having judged the Scandinavian tune contest. He named the tune after having taken the short trip on the ferry across the Öresund from Sweden to Denmark and back again. In Iain's original manuscript the tunes are in 9/8 rythm, but here the tune has been written in 3/4 time to give a better representation of the polska timing.
